Minutes—KCCL Board of Directors Meeting November 17, 2009

Chairman Barry Ott called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM. The roll was called and the members present were Roger Hill, Terry Tobias, Bruce Ford, Ed Ekleberry, Cart Huyser, Barry Ott, Vic Scudder, Larry Menetti, Red Shepard, Rich Smith, Sam Yeo, Ralph Rader, and Brian Schwalm. The members excused were, Paul Zandee, Steve Erickson, and Pete Peterson

The minutes of the October meeting were reviewed and approved.

Manager's Report

Tim Wiley presented the Manager's report. Tim informed the Board that the current membership is at 565. Tim asked the board to allow him to contact other clubs to try to sell nine hand-set trap machines that are no longer of use to the club. There were no objections from the Board members.

President's Report

President Vic Scudder reported that he and three other members ran a successful "sight-in day" at the rifle range. Vic voiced his support for the club manager's efforts and asked the Board to be more supportive as well. Vic asked the Board and the manager to not discuss club business in public.

MUCC Delegate Report

No report.

Old Business

The club manager had asked the Board to allow him to purchase 2 more trap machines for the Sporting Clays course at a cost of around \$5,000. A motion was made and seconded. After discussion the vote on the motion failed. The Board may take another look at purchasing the machines at a future date.

New Business

The manager made a request to the Board for funds to repair the road before winter. A motion was made and seconded. The motion was tabled. It was decided that the manager should make arrangements to "spot fix" the worst areas for now. The Finance Committee will look at including road repair funds in the 2010 budget so that the road repairs may be completed in the spring.

Treasurer's Report

Ralph Rader presented the financial report. The club's financial situation continues to improve. A motion was made, seconded and approved to accept the report. Ralph voiced concern that given the current economic situation in Michigan, the club may not do as well in the coming year. Ralph reported that the Budget Committee meeting had to be rescheduled because not all Finance Committee members were present and he did not have all the information needed to prepare the budget. Ralph made a request for the Board to consider putting a small amount of money away in a fund for future projects at the club. No action was taken on the request at this time.
