Jason Cook reviewed the new shortened and more precise treasurer's report. A motion was made, seconded and approved to accept the report.

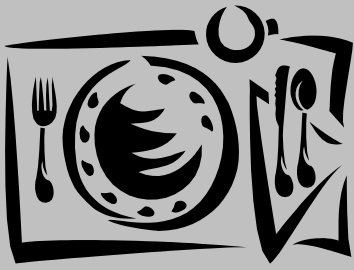
